in the Hampton Water area? (TB): My daughter

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petitions, we did emails, we emailed the MPs, we

met all the local councillors. We had a massive,

long a period of time did this all take? (TB): Oh it's probably over a year. (EP):

In terms of the local residents how strong is the opposition to having a Catholic school there?

(TB):Oh we'd got really strong support opposing

the school on lots of grounds. Lots of people

are doing it on the faith basis as well as the planning side: so having a school that's

only going to serve 20% of the catchment area is obviously going to attract a lot

more traffic coming in and out of a small area;

there are also the fact that Hampton Water is

a very diverse community and there's lots of faiths and there's also non-faiths

so the majority of people felt that they were excluded from being able to attend a local school

based on what their faith was. (EP): Could you, just in terms of the figures,

for the council. (EP): So basically this school is

just going to make most people in the area just

have to commute further to send their children to

0:05:40.960,0:05:45.680

school? (TB): Yes you're going to have children

that can't get into the school leaving the area

0:05:45.680,0:05:49.760

and then you're going to have children from out of

the area that don't need to live on the doorstep

0:05:49.760,0:05:54.280

of the school because they will be guaranteed a place on their faith traveling in. (EP):

Terri, what was your involvement in the campaign

against this new faith school? (TH): Well I

elected in May 2019 and I sit on the Children and

Education Scrutiny Committee so we meet regularly

to scrutinise the Council's work involving children and education. And it was brought

being planned or the application was being made

a really emotive subject. There were an awful lot

as is often the case with Council-based issues

schools are full and you can go on Facebook and

have trouble getting their children to the

'It's fine, the situation's okay.' Many residents

been following to allow the school to be built hadn't been done properly and we tried to get

to be clear: this is a Conservative controlled

Council isn't it? (TH): Yes. (EP): And in terms of how the Council took the process forward now,

Academies was trying to put in their own bid.

How did the Council decide to choose the Catholic Diocese bid rather than the Hampton

Academy's bid? (TH): The Diocese school was what was presented to the Council. The Hampton,

DFE criteria in that wave so that school was not a

possibility as far as the Council were concerned.

It was this Diocese school that was what was in

front of them and in the 'call-in' procedure they talked about all the other alternatives

if they refused the Diocese school and they all

involved more time, no guarantee that the Hampton

Academy school would be put forward, and it would cost them more money as well and they'd

in a hurry to get this school through? (TH): They

school in place? (TH): At the meeting it was said

that the Council would lose what's called 'basic

my understanding of this is that the Government

allow the Council to go to schools and to increase

What was said in the meeting was that if this voluntary-aided school is built we don't lose that

90% comes from the Department for Education

it. (EP): So again it's very much in the financial

this journey. (EP): In what sort of ways, could you give some examples? (TB): They are seeing it

is definitely not the case. If anything, it's

about inclusion. It's about including all faiths and not just singling out one faith. (EP): What

actually teach? Have you had any thoughts from

parents on that about the difficulties of going to

a school which advocates the Catholic ethos? (TB):

their admissions criteria. It does say that they

follow the Catholic ethos and part of the building

school? (TB): No, not at all. They did say that

they would have a meeting at some stage but I think it's difficult because of Covid but

there has been no communication from them. (EP):

Terri, in terms of the process so, after the

Council said it was going to be this Catholic school or nothing,

how was the process moved forward by the Council?

Was it transparent? Were people, were councillors

and other people in the area given the opportunity

to make representations? (TH): So the call-in

process is me or me and my colleagues saying we

think that there's been something wrong with this

process with this decision. We based that on the

lack of them proving that there was a local need.

a local desire for this school, we said that the consultation didn't prove that people in Hampton

process the local authority are asked to follow

good enough. So you know the consultation went

out to Peterborough City so obviously a lot of the

responses came back that were in support because we believe that they were passed

to church members, you know members of the

Catholic diocese, so we couldn't actually

pinpoint from the data that there was a need in

Hampton Water for this type of school. However

the Council have to look at a variety of different

aspects. That wasn't one that they absolutely had

to prove. They had to pay attention to it; they had to do a consultation. They did a consultation

but even if the results clearly showed that people in Hampton water were 100% against it,

that doesn't matter. There's all these other aspects that they have to look at which they did.

And so there was no fault in the process. And I

think that's frustrating for people to understand

discussing the ethics. I believe we were told

religious issue was 'off the table'. You were not

No she was part of the congregation at one of the local Catholic churches, but no there wasn't,

they weren't there at all. (EP): And Terri was the diocese represented at all,

apart from through this Council you mentioned,

were they in any of the call-in meetings? (TH):

They had representatives there who spoke on their

behalf, I believe the Head from one of the other

as well, in support. I mean at the consultations

that Tracy is referring to they actually held three across the city. Two of them were at

their own, at other Catholic schools, which were not attended by anyone. I was at that

consultation with Tracy that was in the area where

the local residents weren't happy and it did end

up a little bit hostile between the residents

was no sort of interest by the diocese in sort of

recognising the hostility of the local residents?

(TH): I think that they feel that their change

to their own subscription criteria was an acknowledgement I believe that was put forward as:
